

These bunch of amazing students are ready to guide, support, represent and lead our student body this term and as we head into 2017!


We also would like to take the time to congratulate Shanae H, Talyssa B and Jasmine-Lee F for their fantastic and professional performances during our NAIDOC assembly.

They then teamed up with the students from Senior Science to attend the "Museum of Health and Disease" at the University of NSW to supplement their studies in modules – "Search for Better Health" and "Medical Technology". Year 7 Science students had a wondrously exciting couple of days with all the animals on the Zoo Snooze at Taronga Park Zoo. Science is planning further excursions for our other year groups. We are all so excited and just can't wait.

The HSC Exams are now in full swing. In Science we have our Biology, Chemistry, Senior Science and Physics students sitting these exams.
