From the Relieving Principal Mr. Bates

Dear Parents and Caregivers,

I would like to take this opportunity to thank each member of our school community from teachers through to students and ancillary staff alike for the conduct you all portrayed in trying circumstances during the school evacuation on Tuesday. The school was targeted as a bomb hoax along with Thomas Reddall High School on Tuesday morning and the school was evacuated whilst emergency services conducted their business. I was very impressed with the sensible behaviour and cooperation demonstrated by our students on this day. Police are now tracing the callers, which is an easy thing to do apparently, and should be in a position to question suspects later this week.

As the close of the year approaches and we prepare for the beginning of 2017 our staff and students are preparing for the welcome of our new year 7 students. We will have orientation day on Tuesday 6 December and our peer support leaders have been trained in preparation for this day and the ensuing year. Thanks to Mr Douglas, Mr Baca and Ms Needham for the training of these students. The school has also decided to invest in the services of a third Deputy Principal and the process for selecting this person has begun in order for them to commence on the first day next year.

I would like to thank the parents of our outgoing Year 12 students and thank them for their contributions to our school community throughout the past six years, some of whom have attended our bi-term meetings and others have contacted the school on various occasions to ensure the school was advised or keeping up with best practice. The Year 12 formal last week was a great success and I would like to attribute this and much of the fine work from Year 12 to their Year Advisor, Ms Catherine Modica, who worked tirelessly to ensure each student in year 12 felt safe and happy at school and worked to achieve the best results they could achieve.

On Tuesday I attended Beverly Park School for their annual awards ceremony and presented awards, and was delighted to witness four of our own students receive awards, representing the many students of Leumeah High School who have participated in assisting at events or sport days, as volunteers of the year with Mr Geoffrey Parry-Ewing. Thank you to Mr Parry-Ewing and the SRC students who have attended all year to assist at Beverley Park School; you are very much appreciated at the school.

Thank you to all of our P&C members who support our community links throughout the year. A special thank you to our outgoing P&C President Kylie Devine, whose dedication and efforts in leading our P&C over the last few years have been impressive and are very much appreciated.
