From the Principal Mr. Zielinski

Dear Parents and Caregivers,

Thank you to the many families who braved the chilly weather to attend the subject selection information evenings for Year 9 - 2018 and Year 11 - 2018 in the first week of term. These evenings are very important in providing students and their parents valuable information regarding subject selection, NESA requirements and rules and procedures that students must adhere to in order to successfully meet requirements for the award of the HSC or a ROSA and to discuss with staff what options might be best suited for their children. A reminder to all parents that our second Yr 7-11 Parent teacher evening will be held on Monday the 28th August from 3.40 till 7.00pm. I urge parents to take the opportunity to talk with teachers so that we can share each child's achievements and indicate areas for improvement over the remainder of the year.

Congratulations to Ms Woolley, the CAPA staff, roadie crew and all students who performed in the school musical last term. It was another smashing success. Earlier this month the school celebrated NAIDOC week that culminated in a wonderful assembly celebrating aboriginal custom and culture and then was followed with events throughout the day that allowed all students to reflect on the importance of aboriginal culture to all Australians. My thanks to Ms Roberts, Ms Carter, Mr Brennan and all the Aboriginal portfolio team, along with the students from ARC.

Our successful year on the sporting paddock continues. Our boys U/14 Rugby League side have made it through to the state semi-finals. This is the second time in 4 years that we have made the final 4 in the state. We wish them well in the semi final as they battle Chifley High, the team that defeated us in the 2014 Buckley Shield State final. Not to be outdone, our girls' Rugby League team has progress through to the final 8 in the state. We wish both teams the best of success.

Exciting news for all students and TAS staff is the refurbishment of one of our kitchens to full commercial standards is almost complete. The refurbishment is valued at \$450,000 and provides students with the most up to date facilities to teach hospitality and food technology. Other upgrades the school will receive in the coming months include new carpeting in much of the school and replacement of rooves in some of the block which should see an end to the many leaks we suffer in very heavy rain.

LTAS NEWS (Life, Technology and Applied Studies).

The LTAS faculty offers a diverse range of courses to students from Technology Mandatory course in Years 7 and 8 for all, to elective 100 hour courses in Years 9 and 10 and 200 hour courses in Years 11 and 12.

A major focus currently is introducing activities involving **STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths)** which features researching, designing, making, coding, collaborative group work and other digital enterprises for twenty first century learners. Three courses evolving in Year 8 Technology Mandatory are challenges with Lego Mindstorm Robotics, Crack a Code using coding for an electronic circuit and an Aeronautical Design using a power anchor for flight simulation testing.

Year 8 with Mr Shaw recently entered a team in the **NSW State Championship Aeronautical challenge** on Friday the 9/6/17 with the smart crew coming sixth in the state. See photo display of the event.

Under construction is a state of art **Commercial Kitchen** which is part way through construction and ready for action by the end of July for all students. This is a huge bonus in access to current facilities for the industry training that will be available in 2018 for a course selection for Year 10 Hospitality Certificate 1 and Year 11-12 Hospitality food and Beverage Certificate II.

An important reminder for all is the need for school shoes as **safe footwear** to be worn as a mandatory part of school uniform, which is essential for participation in these courses. Material **course fees** for Semester 1 are also due to cover resources consumed by students.

A wide variety of **electives will be offered for 2018 by LTAS for Year 9, 10 and 11** and close reading of the Elective Booklets soon to be available, give a full description of content, assessment and requirements.
